

ANTI-RAGGING MEASURES

Ragging is a criminal offence as per the Hon'ble Supreme Court verdict. Ragging in any form, within or outside the University campus, is legally banned.

Defining ragging: any conduct by a student, whether by words, spoken or written, or by an act which includes physical abuse, lewd acts, teasing, rough or rude treatment, indulging in rowdy, indisciplined or obscene activities, which may cause or likely to cause annoyance, undue hardship, physical or physiological harm or mental trauma or rising of apprehension or fear in fresher/junior students or other students or forcing a student to do any act, which, such a student is not willing to do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment or danger to a student's life or adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior students is tantamount to ragging.

Note: a conduct is defined as ragging in terms of the feeling of humiliation it generates in the victim.



PUNISHABLE ELEMENT OF RAGGING:

- Abetment/instigation to ragging.
- Criminal conspiracy to rag.
- Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging.
- Public nuisance created during ragging.
- Violation of decency and morals through ragging.
- Injury to body, causing hurt/mental trauma or grievous hurt.
- Wrongful restrain.
- Wrongful confinement.
- Use of criminal force.
- Assault as well as sexual offences or even unnatural offences.
- Extortion.
- Criminal trespass.
- Offences against property.
- Criminal intimidation.
- Attempt to commit any or all of the above mentioned offences against the victim.
- Physical or psychological humiliation.
- Any act/abuse disrupts or disturbs the regular Academic activity of a Student.
- All other offences following under the definition of "Ragging".

PUNISHMENT AGAINST RAGGING

One who directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets or instigates ragging, inside or outside the University, shall be punished. Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence, as established by the anti-ragging committee of the University, the possible punishment for those guilty of ragging at the University is as follows:

- Suspension from attending the classes and withdrawal of all Academic facilities.
- Withholding/withdrawing of Scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
- Forfeiting Campus Placements opportunity / recommendations.
- Debarring from appearing in any Tests/Examinations or other academic activities.
- Withholding of results.
- Debarring from representing the University in any regional, National or International Meets, Tournament, Youth Festivals, Competitions etc.
- Suspension/expulsion from the Hostel.
- Cancellation of Admission.
- Rustication from the University for a period ranging from 1 to 4 semesters.
- Expulsion from the University.
- Fine up to Rs. 25,000/-.
- Collective Punishment: When the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the University may award a collective punishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on the potential raggers.

In addition, in case single incident of ragging, a First Information Report (FIR) may be filed with the local police, the possible punishment includes rigorous imprisonment (in compliance with the order of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India).

ICC – Internal Complaints Committees
